

Morgan Trail Award Rules

Divisions:

Pleasure Division: The Pleasure Division will consist of mileage/points according to Table A and are for those organized rides/drives where the horses are NOT being judged against fitness criteria, I.E. competitive. Example – charity ride/drives over a prescribed course, such as the Equine Foundation of Canada or judged pleasure ride/drives, club organized ride/drives, mileage ride/drives in conjunction with competitive or endurance events, etc. A descriptive flyer must be submitted for each event attended.

Competitive Division: The Competitive Division will consist of mileage/points according to Table B. Competitive events must be completed within a specific time limit at a moderate pace. Horses are judged and placed according to their condition or level of fitness throughout the event. A provincial, regional, national or international regulating body sanctions these events. A descriptive flyer must be submitted for each event attended.

Endurance Division: The Endurance Division will consist of mileage/points according to Table B. Endurance races vary in length from 50 –100 miles. Any ride under 50 miles counts for mileage only. Placings are made according to the order of finish, provided that the veterinary judges are satisfied that the horses are in good condition and capable of continuing in good health. Ride’N’Tie events are included in this division. A provincial, regional, national or international regulating body sanctions these events. A descriptive flyer must be submitted for each event attended.

Rules:

- Only Purebred Morgans or Part Morgans registered with the Canadian Morgan Horse Association in the name of their current owner who is a resident of Canada, are eligible. A copy of the papers showing ownership must be submitted with the initial entry and with each change of owner.
- Horses may be ridden/driven by anyone, but the prizes will be awarded only to the registered owner or lessee.
- If the horse is sold, points will stay with the horse and prizes will be awarded to the new owner.
- Horses may earn points in more than one division in one season, but each event is only eligible for points in one division.

- All Canadian and International events will be eligible for points.
- Points earned between December 1st of the previous calendar year, and November 30th of the present calendar year will be eligible.
- Entries will be audited.
- Lifetime mileage awards will be accumulated from all divisions and reflect the exact mileage completed.

Lifetime Mileage Awards:

The top 2 horses will receive Champion and Reserve Champion Zone Certificates for each zone yearly.

The top 2 horses from across Canada will receive National Champion and National Reserve Champion Certificates yearly.

1,000 miles receives a Justin Morgan Award

4,000 miles will be a Superior Justin Morgan Award

2007 will be considered the "Grandfather Year". Horses that were originally entered in the original Morgan Trail Sweepstakes that are still competing may, on provision of verified mileage, count those miles previously earned. Horses that were not originally entered in the Morgan Trail Sweepstakes may count verified miles earned from 2004-2006 in 2007 only. All entry requirements must be met.

Morgan owners who have joined the Morgan Trail awards and also own horses that were part of the original Morgan Trail Sweepstakes and are now retired from competition, may receive recognition of lifetime miles completed by providing verified mileage for the years 2004 –2006 inclusive. Recognition will be in the Canadian Morgan magazine.
